GOAL A: Explore and demonstrate an understanding of the impact of aging for the individual.

Learning Outcomes: The student will

- A-1. Develop an understanding of the process of aging
- A-2. Recognize ageism and changing stereotypes of the older person
- A-3. Analyze demographic trends and the projected effects on the community

GOAL B: Explore and demonstrate an understanding of the critical issues of aging.

Learning Outcomes: The student will

- B-1. Examine the phenomenon of aging in place and residential options for older adults
- B-2. Identify the elements of healthy aging and develop a strategy to promote wellness with senior adults
- B-3. Recognize the challenges to healthy aging, including chronic illness, dementia, elder abuse, neglect, and financial exploitation
- B-4. Examine the impact of caregiving for relatives raising others' children, caregivers of the chronically ill and frail elderly, and business
- B-5. Assess end of life issues, including ethical dilemmas for families and professionals and how to die with dignity
