

AHS7685 Fund Development and Fund Raising in the Human Services Environment – AHS 7685
Course Syllabus and Outline Redeveloped 2021

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The student will review historical funding sources and determine future interest areas and niche development opportunities to support a non profit agency.

Learning outcomes: The student will:

- C-1: Develop strategies to broaden existing funding elements to support an agency's core programs, operations, or capital needs for the next three year cycle.
- C-2: Improve skills in identifying new funding sources by searching the internet, corporate documents, foundations resources and individual contacts and relationships.
- C-3: Manage and supervise the various relationships with key volunteers and professionals to ensure success in contacting appropriate corporate and foundation grant providers through personal contacts.

GOAL D:

The student will develop new partnerships and collaborative relationships with other nonprofits to increase the success rate in securing new funds for organizations.

Learning outcomes: The student will:

- D-1: Review sample development elements to identify weaknesses that may have impacted the goals as stated by an agency.
- D-2: Prepare the learning tools for key staff and volunteers to become knowledgeable promoters of an agency's vital services and programs when communicating with potential funding sources.
- D-3: Create a strategic plan for new partnership arrangements with similar nonprofits to attract new or existing donors for vital mutual programs and services.

GOAL E:

Students will use appropriate writing and oral skills.

Learning outcomes: The student will:

- E-1 Prepare written work using the appropriate APA style.
- E-2 Present oral reports using appropriate grammar, etc.

V. TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The teaching methods used will be a mix of discussions, readings, assignments (papers and/or projects), case studies. Our class discussions will be based on our text, research and observations. Instructor's training and experience as a fundraising professional will also come into play as well as the skills and assets of the class. Students are required to actively participate in the class through individual assignments, group/team projects, and discussion boards. Students will create and present a fundraising plan as part of their final grade.
