4. Critique clinical practice guidelines considering their application, effectiveness, and feasibility.
5. Analyze frameworks for evidence-based practice and the evaluation of available evidence.
6. Systematically evaluate quantitative and qualitative research.

7. Evidence critical thinking skills in class discussion, written work, online assignments, and oral/visual/voice-enhanced/multimedia presentations.
