At Wilmington University, Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) in the Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) program is defined by the following three criteria:

- 1. Earn a B or better in all DNP courses.
 - a. If less than a B is earned in a DNP course, students can re-take the course one (1) time.
 - b. A maximum of two (2) courses may be repeated.
- 2. Maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher.
- 3. Complete all degree requirements within five (5) years.

Failure to meet these requirements will result in academic dismissal from the program.
