COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will focus on reviewing the factsvents, victims and perpetrators of the Holocaust in Germany and other parts of Europe during Hitler's Third Reticival cover the origins of the Holocaust, implementation, efforts to rescue victims and those fifto bring the perpetrators to justice. - 3. Create a timeline of the sequence of steps that culminated in the Holocaust.
- 4. Analyze the personal experiences of initial Holocaust survivors and those involved in their rescue.
