COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course will introduce the student to bioethical concepts that impact nursing practice. Students will focus on ethical concepts as they apply to philosophy and nursing practice. Conceptual, factual, and normative issues will be explored to provide the framework within which many arguments of biomedical ethics are formulated.

Group Work with Ppt Learning Tool (All Objectives) 15%

Article critique (All Objectives) 15%

This assignment requires students to select an article from current nursing literature or one provided from the readings lists which discusses a philosophical/ethical issue related to Moral Distress. Write a brief paper following the Article critique guidelines provided and assessing its application to your professional practice.

Kaltura Video (All Objectives) 10%

Each student will develop a Kaltura video based on HeLa cells of Henrietta Lacks readings and websites. The video should be creative and must answer the question should the government in your opinion provide financial compensation to the family? See the specific instructions for this assignment in the course.

Reflective paper (All Objectives) 10%

Students view a “The Last Lecture” containing themes related to the philosophical decisions, including ethical ones and write a reflective paper.

Online Ethics Quiz Paper (All Objectives) 5%

Students take the online ethics quiz and then write a 1–2-page summary of their results and how it influences their values and opinions in their profession.

Discussion Boards & AACN Essentials (All Objectives) 15%

Students will discuss the issues of nursing ethics and professional practice. (Note: This is a discussion board assignment.)
