Constitution of the Wilmington University Student Government Association

Article I—Name and Objectives

Section1: The name of the society which is governed by **to** stitution is the Wilmington University Student Government Association, hereinafter referred to as the SGA.

Section2: The objectives of this SGA are to protect the rights and privilegits of embers they pertain to Wilmington University and all of its affiliates, to promote quality education and keep academic standards high within the University, and to further the social and academic development its members sindividuals and as whole.

Section 3: The defined in the University catalog prevailing.

A memberhasfull voting and speakingrights at all meetingsof the SGA, while astudent not in good standing with the University has speaking, but no voting, privileges. Nor does the latter have the right to make or second a motion, nominate, or run for office.

Section2: Membership in the SGA will be automatically rescinded up**e**rst**h**spension of any student from the University.

Article III—Officers

Section1: The officers of the SGA will be as follows:

President • Vice President • Secretary • Treasurer

The duties will be those which are customarily associated with these offices Section 2: The officers holding these positions (Section 1, above), will constitute the Executive Board of the Student Government Association.

The President of the SGA is the Chairperson of the Executive Board.

Section3: The elections of these officers, and their terms in office, will be in accordance with the bys of this Constitution.

Article IV — Meetings

Section1: SGA meetings will be held regularly on a day and at a time decided upon by the Executive Board. The Board will giveall students notice of this meeting time.

Section2: A special meeting of the SGA may bn in either case.

Section 3: Meetings will be conducted by either formal or informal Parliamentary Procedure, this being decided at the start of the meeting majority vote. A

For appeals of the Parliamentarian's decisions, "Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised" will be the deciding authority.

Article V—Amendments

This Constitution may be amended by the carriage offirmative two-thirds (2/3) vote of those members present, stating the alteration specifically, in an SGA meeting called for that purpose.
